UNITED WAY OF CENTRAL ALABAMA OFFERS FAMILIES A WAY TO SAVE MONEY THROUGH A STATEWIDE 2:1 MATCH PROGRAM

United Way of Central Alabama offers the Individual Development Accounts (IDA) program. This state-wide program is a matched savings program that allows students and families to build assets and establish skills for financial self-sufficiency. Through the match program, individuals are able to pay for college or job training, purchase a first-time home or start or expand a small business. Applicants must have a low to moderate income and be employed.

The program has a 2:1 match ratio. Individuals can save up to \$2,000 and receive a \$4,000 match. They will be able to use up to \$6,000 to go toward college, a home or a business. Parents are able to save on behalf of their student. Senior year high school students can participate in the program through a special matching option. Students can save up to \$500 in earned income and receive a \$4,000 match for a total of \$4,500 that can be used for qualified college related or job training expenses.

All applicants must take financial literacy courses. Based on their specific saving goal, they may complete an education plan, business plan and/or credit counseling.

This program has proven to be successful for many. More than 200 people have purchased a home, 187 individuals have attended college and 57 people have started a new business.
